As I mentioned in our previous letter, in December Alden and I flew to Kentucky to help my dad replace the engine in his truck. While boarding the plane, I received a text message from my mom. She informed me she had tested positive for Covid. We ended up spending the first two weeks of January with me trying to get over the virus, and the 2nd and 3rd weeks of January with Sheena and the children getting over it. With our services still being outdoors, I only had to cancel one Wednesday night service, and I was able to hold services for the rest of the time that I needed to quarantine. Sheena dealt with the virus much worse than I did, and she was out of church for a week and a half. We missed her piano playing, and the kids who attend missed the children's services that she does. I am thankful that I am privileged to serve the Lord on the Reservation with my wife. January helped me to remember what a blessing she is and how much she does that I don't always remember.

Using what the Lord has given us

This summer, we purchased a 15-passenger bus with a diesel engine from a church in Yuma, Arizona for \$500. Unfortunately, our church does not have the money to do the necessary repairs currently, nor do we have a place to currently bring 15 people. My wife had the idea to have children's services on the bus until we can repair it. On average, she has 10 kids on the bus for children's church. This has really helped our church attendance as well. None of the other churches in town have a children's service, so we have even had some extra visitors who have come to bring their kids for the service.

Trying to Reach our Community with the Gospel

This month we have also started preparations for our I Love My Church Sunday. We hold this every year around Valentine's Day. This year, we ordered special tracts that say I Love My Church, and we are having a contest to see who can pass out the most tracts. The very first night after introducing the contest, one man and his wife had already passed out 20 tracts each and had a visitor to Sunday Night service! I can't wait to report next month about how many total tracts were handed out! We are looking forward to this service on February 13th. Thank you for all your prayers, and your faithful giving.
